

## Penketh's Home – School learning offer and contingency plan

Teaching assistants in the afternoon session will be delivering group 0 pre teach and post teach sessions and interventions via teams or in the classroom Children at home remotely can access if they would normally in school If only a few children are at home, they will be on the screen in the 0 classroom and can put up their hand on Teams, so teacher can see this. - Laptops/IPads for teachers to assist in the delivery of teaching from school and/or home
- Interactive whiteboard to support lesson delivery in the classroom
- Laptops for children without personal devices at home
- Access to Microsoft TEAMS for all relevant staff and pupils
