# OUR LEARNING

**In Reception...** What a fantastic first full week it has been for our Reception children! They have settled beautifully into school routines and shown such enthusiasm in everything they do. We are so impressed with how well they have adapted to their new environment and how confidently they are approaching each day. The children have truly made their teachers very proud, and we are excited to see all the wonderful learning and growing they will do this year!

**In Year 1...** What a wonderful start to the year our new Year 1 class have made! The children have well and truly exceeded all of our expectations. They are definitely ready for this next chapter of their primary school journey. Over the past few days we have enjoyed counting, writing, playing and getting to know each other. The children have also loved their first Forest School session with Mrs Copperwheat! It is going to be a fantastic year.

**In Year 2...** What a wonderful week in Year 2! The children have settled in brilliantly and are working incredibly hard. In English, we have used noun phrases to describe a character from our story. In Maths, we have partitioned two digit numbers into tens and ones and enjoyed using 'Dienes' to make place value robots. In Science, we have learnt about omnivores, carnivores and herbivores, and worked hard to sort animals into the correct group.

**In Year 3...** What a brilliant start to the Year! This week in Year 3, we have worked hard in English as we have started our text 'The Iron Man'. We have made our own predictions, created a setting description, character description and made our own Kenning Poem! In Maths, we have worked hard on place value partitioning numbers and counted in hundreds. In PSHE, we have been thinking about what it means to be a good friend and how we can apply these values into our own lives. In History, we have been learning all about the Stone Age and Skara Brae.

**In Year 4...** Year Four have made a fantastic start to the term listening, doing as asked and being the best they can be. I am very proud of them all. They have begun to learn about the Mayans, the digestive system, how to create an optical illusion and how to be safe online. The highlight of the week was creating descriptions of a storm setting.

**In Year 5...** We have had a fantastic start to year 5. I have been so impressed by their eagerness to learn, maturity and perseverance. We have started to look at our English text this week, 'When We Walked the Moon' and have written some excellent first hand pieces as if we had landed on the moon ourselves! Well done Year 5!

**In Year 6...** This week Year Six have blown us away with their behaviour and attitudes to learning. In Maths, we have explored numbers to ten million! This has, at times, been tricky but we didn't give up. In English, we have made predictions about characters and then explored the difference between structures typical of formal and informal speech. Mrs Anderson and I are also impressed with Y6's approach to Shared Reading, we have enjoyed 'The Wolves of Willoughby Chase' by Joan Aiken. We have learnt to text mark words and phrases as evidence for questions.
