OUR LEARNING

In Reception...We began our new book 'Stanley's Stick' by hunting for lots of sticks amongst the school grounds. We used our imaginations and fine motor skills to decorate the sticks with pom-poms, pipe cleaners and sequins. This week, we have written about what our stick might become. The children have had some brilliant ideas including 'motorbike', 'a magic wand' and 'hot chocolate spoon'!

In Year 1... This week we have been finishing off our English work on 'The Lion Inside'. We have been writing character descriptions of the lion and the mouse and then comparing them! In Maths, we have worked incredibly hard, using part-whole models to write linked addition sentences. We have also loved using the BeeBots in our Computing session this week!

In Year 2...The children have loved learning lots of different facts about owls in preparation for our fact file writing piece.



In Maths, we are continuing to add and subtract numbers that cross the tens boundary. In our Science lessons, we have been learning about different habitats and the animals that we could find in each one.

In Year 3... This week Year 3 received a letter from the aliens that live on the moon. They have written back as Bob (the man on the moon). Also they have been adding and subtracting ones, tens and hundreds from 3-digit numbers using bead strings and number lines.

As part of their Science work they have learnt how magnets can repel and attract and have 2 poles – a North and a South.
