OUR LEARNING

In Reception...Reception have returned to school ready to learn! We received a letter from Mr Johannson, he told us to read his favourite book 'The Extraordinary Gardener' and help him to plant seeds. We got to work straight away, writing a list of what we will need to do and preparing our planters ready to start planting next week! In our Creative Area, we have been creating symmetrical butterflies using paints and folding our own paper! In Maths, we have been busy using the numicon to make number bonds to 10 and writing the number sentence. Well done Reception!

In Year 1...Year 1 have made a brilliant start to the new half-term! In English, we have begun to look at our new story 'Toys in Space'. The children are very excited to learn more about this fantastic book! In Maths, we have been looking at identifying 2D shapes and their properties. In Art, we have been making sculptures using different coloured card. The children were very enthusiastic about this and loved using their imaginations to be as creative as possible!

In Year 2...Year 2 have loved reading to the end of 'Jim and the Beanstalk' and enjoyed writing a thank you letter to Jim. We tried to include noun phrases and commas in a list and questions. In Maths, we have completed our unit on money and are keen to start our work on fractions. Our first Forest School session was amazing! We played in a mud kitchen, used a magnifying glass to look for insects and made brilliant dens. In DT, we designed our own delicious soup in preparation for our making session next week.

In Year 3... Year 3 loved learning about the life of an Egyptian man, played a classic Egyptian game, took part in a battle and even had a go with a bow and arrow! In English, we have started looking at our new class text 'Journey' which is a book with no words! It will be interesting to see the ideas we come up with in the coming weeks! In Maths, we have been working incredibly hard on our multiplication and will use these skills when we tackle division! In RE, we have been learning about our duties within our families, and school lives too! In PE, we have been playing lots of games and working on our multisport skills.

In Year 4...Welcome to the summer term! The time is flying! The children have made an excellent start to the half term learning some new vocabulary connected with the Rainforest, explaining to each other how to halve a four digit number and beginning our Art work based on clay sculpture. We have also started to learn a very special song that we have written for our end of year assembly!

In Year 5... Year 5 have settled back amazingly well this week. We have started our new text in English lessons, 'The Paperbag Prince', which discusses how we should take care of the environment. Within Maths lessons, we have learnt how to add fractions with different denominators. We are fully throwing ourselves into Reading, Maths and SPAG revision; the class have enjoyed some games being thrown in for a little fun (especially a game of bingo here and there!) The class are working hard to reduce errors in Maths and are refining their checking skills too. We are so proud of their progress and couldn't ask more of their attitude to learning.
