In Reception...

Reception have been searching for Naughty Bus this week! We have written missing posters and stuck them up arous



and stuck them up around school to let everyone know he has gone. We have also been painting pictures of the bus and singing our Naughty Bus song! We hope he returns safely to us next week...

In Year 1...This week, we were excited to perform in our end of year assembly and made Mr Towey very proud! In Maths, we have impressed using skip counting to solve multiplication problems. In English we have been re-writing the story of Goldilocks and Just The One Bear. Next week we are looking forward to having our transition day with our new Year 2 teacher!

In Year 2... Year 2 have had another busy week! In English, we have designed our own secret giants and written our own character descriptions, including lots of expanded noun phrases and exciting vocabulary! In Maths, we have enjoyed learning about different ways to represent data and now are able to interpret information from different charts and graphs. In DT, we have worked incredibly hard to stitch our own hand puppets - they look amazing!

In Year 3...We have worked incredibly hard, adding and subtracting fractions! We have used lots of our previous learning to help support including our own fraction walls and we even used cake to consolidate our learning! In English, we have been identifying persuasive techniques to help for when we plan and write our final piece next week. In Geography, we have written about our region, its uses and the environment. In Music we have loved singing, working on our call and response techniques.

In Year 4...Another week done! Only 2 more weeks in Year Four! The children are giving one last push before we finish for the summer. They have written fantastic character descriptions about Fox, including fronted adverbials, conjunctions and writing in the third person, learnt how to use tenths and hundredths as decimals and found out what happens when different liquids are frozen. On top of all of that they have completed their Reading Plus assessments and now have their logins ready for Year Five.

In Year 5...This week, Year 5 have planned their own story which is based on 'The Hunter'. We have recapped our knowledge of quadrilaterals and triangles - quiz us to see if we know our shapes; isosceles, scalene, equilateral? We had a busy day of Art where we used Melanie Yazzi's work as our inspiration to create our own African booklets called 'Zines'. We completed a PSHE lesson which explained how our response to a situation can have an impact on the outcome - positive responses can lead to positive outcomes! Have a lovely weekend, Year 5!

In Year 6... This week the majority of Year 6 have sampled two days of secondary school life. Alongside their high school visits, we have been very creative. We have made songs about the impacts of climate change in Geography. We also enjoyed a Judo workshop, where we were shown elements of personal safety and then we started working on our Leaver's assembly! Such a busy time!
