In Reception...Reception are well and truly in Christmas mode this week! We enjoyed exploring our new Christmas Post Office roleplay area and creating Santa's sleigh outside using the crates and dressing up. We visited the Library on Tuesday morning and learnt all about the books and how to get a library card. The children were extremely well behaved when walking down and listening in the library too. Well done Reception!

In Year 1... This week in Year 1, we have continued to look at subtracting, using counters to help us work out subtraction facts to 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 systematically. We have also loved learning about reptiles in Science and now know all about mammals, amphibians and reptiles!

In Year 2...We have had a very exciting week! We had a visit from a snowman who needed our help. We entered our classroom to find lots of snow, a postcard and a carrot! We have described where he lives to help him find his way back home. In DT, we have designed our own hand puppets in preparation for making them next week.

In Year 3... This week year 3 have begun looking at a new text 'The Elves and the Shoemaker'. They were very excited to find out who would use a thimble, sewing thread and a hammer and nails. They will be writing descriptions of the Shoemakers workshop.
